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Principal's Letter – Term 4, September 2013

Dear Parent/Guardian

Welcome to Term 4 at QPS

It felt like it was not too long ago that I wrote my first letter as the Principal of Qifa to you and the pupils to welcome them to the start of term one. In a flash, we have approached the last term in the school year. What an amazing journey it has been! Please allow me to share some highlights with you.

***Every Student, an Engaged Learner**

Strategic Thrust 1 - Providing a Holistic and Value-added Education

Qifa's Academic and Non-Academic Achievements

Our Lower Primary children, Nyla Putri from Class 2E and Chua Tsze Sin from Class 2G, proved that they may be younger than their seniors but they are no less outstanding as they emerged as **1st Runner-up** and **2nd Runner-up** respectively in the I CAN READ 'Page to Stage' competition. In August this year, Nyla Putri from 2E became the first Qifa pupil to make it to the finals of the 2013 YMCA Plain English Speaking Awards. She also won the Audience Favourite Speaker Award (Lower Primary) and the Silver Honour Roll. In the West 1 Cluster Reading Fiesta, which involved participating schools like Clementi Primary, Henry Park Primary, Nan Hua Primary and Yuhua Primary, our pupils aced the Storytelling Competition as both David Tay from Class 1A and Chua Tsze Sin from Class 2G came in **First** in their respective categories.

In the Asia International Mathematical Olympiad 2013 that was held in Taiwan which involved 11 participating countries from Asia and 15 contestants from Singapore, Tan Wei Xuan and Lim Jinyi from Class 3E represented Qifa Primary School. Wei Xuan turned in a stellar performance, outperforming the rest of the Singapore contestants to clinch the prestigious **Star of Asia** award. In addition, Wei Xuan also obtained a **Gold** award while Jinyi won a **Merit** award.

Our pupils also achieved commendable results at the National Mathematical Olympiad of Singapore 2013 competition. Our Primary Five pupils who participated in this competition secured **5 Silver** awards, **7 Bronze** awards and **3** of them earned an **Honourable Mention**.

In Sports, Ernest Wang Hong Qi from Class 3A won a **Gold** award for Division D Boys in the Tiger Cubs Golf Championships 2013 @National Level. Finally, in the area of Aesthetics, our gifted singer Miguel Pinon from Class 6B beat the other contestants to emerge as the winner in the Judges' Choice for the Solo Category in the Singapore Youth Festival Youth Got Talent 2013 contest. Miguel and his sister, Isabella Pinon from Class 4A, also won the Judges' Choice for the Group Category in the same contest. Their brilliant performances won very positive reviews and they were invited by the organisers to perform at the closing ceremony of the Singapore Youth Festival Youth Got Talent concert. We also discovered another talented performer in Ewan Sean Macrae from 5E who played the lead role 'Troy' in the high school musical at the recent Big Day Out at Resort World Sentosa.

Overseas Immersion Programmes

Our school believes in creating opportunities for experiential learning for our pupils and in the value of internationalisation in developing in our pupils the 21st century competencies of global awareness and cross-cultural skills and sensitivities. Two batches of our Primary Four pupils have gone on a two-day cultural immersion programme to Malacca in September. Some of the highlights of the educational trip included visits to a rubber plantation, a traditional kampong house, the Baba Nyonya Heritage Museum and an organic fruits farm. The pupils also tried their hands at batik painting and traditional games such as top spinning.

For many of the children, this is their first trip away from home without their parents which afforded them the opportunity to develop important lifeskills such as self-reliance and self-discipline. The next group heading out to Taiwan in November is our volleyball sports team for a training cum immersion programme.

Children's Day Celebrations 2013

Children's Day is celebrated every year to recognise the uniqueness of each child and the potential s/he possesses. This year, our celebrations will be held on Thursday, 3 October. It will be a normal school day but our Primary One and Two pupils will join us for the concert at 11:30 a.m. Friday, 4 October will be a school holiday.

Over the years, the school has steadily cultivated a strong partnership with the Singapore Japanese Primary School (SJS). We hosted a group of teachers from SJS in August. They sat in some of the teachers' classes and interacted with our staff. Our Primary Two and Three pupils have visited the SJS as well as hosted their visits in July, and the Primary One pupils will do the same in November. The objectives of our exchange programme with the SJS are to develop global awareness and multi-cultural skills in our pupils as espoused in our school mission to develop 'global citizens'.

This year, our pupils have also been actively involved in community-based events. Our Guzheng Ensemble performing arts group thrilled the audience at the West Coast National Day Dinner which was graced by Guest-of-Honour, Mr S Iswaran, Minister in Prime Minister's Office. Our Chinese Dance group opened the Char Yong National Day Dinner with a lively performance impressing the audience which included the Guest-of-Honour, Senior Minister of State, Ministry of Finance and Ministry of Transport, Mrs Josephine Teo.

At the recent West Coast Garden Kampong Night 2013, 12 of our pupils helped to man the games booths and sold bookmarks with messages on environmental awareness as well as distributed flyers on the Qifa Bagman Returns used schoolbag donation drive.
