Last year, our Primary Six pupils made further improvements from the stellar performance of the 2013 cohort in terms of PSLE aggregate, the number of pupils who made it to the Express Stream (without Express/Normal Academic) and eligibility for secondary education. We have also achieved highly commendable quality results (A* and A) for Higher Mother Tongue, Mother Tongue, Mathematics and Science, with Mathematics and Science surpassing the national mean.

Single Session

I would like to thank all parents for your kind understanding and support as we transit to single session. We have received feedback on the services provided by our bus operator and we would like to assure you that we are monitoring the situation closely, and have met and engaged the bus operator on feedback received.

We observed that some children are dropped off by their parents in school as early as 6.40 a.m. Do note that the pupils only need to report to the school hall by 7.40 a.m. We have adjusted our reporting time from 7.15 a.m. to 7.40 a.m. this year so that the children can have longer hours of sleep before the start of school.

Conduct of Temperature Taking Exercise

As part of our measures to maintain the school's preparedness to ensure that all pupils are familiar with temperature-taking in order to provide a healthy and safe environment for all in the school, there will be a temperature-taking exercise conducted on **Wednesday, 7 January 2015** by the school.
