## 1. Arrival and Dismissal Arrangement

### A. Traffic Movement - Arrival in the Morning

### By Foot

- Students must always be alert and keep a lookout for oncoming traffic
- They may enter the school via two side gates:



Side Gate A
(along West Coast Avenue)
Open from 6.30 am to 7.30 am




**Side Gate C**(along West Coast Grove)
Open from 7.00 am to 7.30 am

## Admin Matters — Arrival and Dismissal Arrangement (cont'd)

#### By Own Transport - recommended traffic flow and drop-off points

- Morning traffic usually begins to peak around 7.15 am. We advise parents to send their child/children earlier, especially on rainy days to avoid congestion outside the school.
- Refer to the diagram below for the recommended traffic flow (indicated by the blue arrows) and the 4 recommended drop-off points, A, B, C and D (indicated by the pink triangles) in and outside the school.
- Please remind your child to use the zebra crossing and/or walk on the pedestrian walkway to the school gate from the drop-off points.




- Parents are allowed to drive into the school before 7.30 am for their child/children to alight at the front porch. We strongly encourage P1 and P2 students to be alighted at the porch as there are staff on duty there to assist them.
- To prevent a build-up of traffic in and around the school, parents are reminded not to linger at the drop-off point. Practise "Drop-and-Go".

# Admin Matters — Arrival and Dismissal Arrangement (cont'd)

#### B. Traffic Movement at Dismissal

- To facilitate movement of school buses, no vehicles are allowed into the school compound to pick up children between 1.00 pm to 2.00 pm.
- Parents are reminded not to park their vehicles illegally and/or leave the vehicle engine running while waiting outside the school.
- For safety and security reasons, parents are only allowed to enter the school if a prior appointment has been arranged.
- Parents/Guardians of P1 and P2 students are allowed into the school to wait for the children at the designated waiting areas shown in the table below. They are to refrain from going into areas including bookshop, canteen and classrooms.
- For P1 and P2 students, teachers will only release them when their parent/guardian is present.



#### Wet Weather Arrangement

• In case of rain, all parents/guardians are allowed to enter the school to wait at the sheltered area/indoor sports hall.

## Admin Matters — Arrival and Dismissal Arrangement (cont'd)

#### C. Taking School Bus

- Students taking school bus are reminded to bring along their school bus card (with QR Code) for attendance taking.
- Students will assemble in the school hall/lower Indoor Sports Hall/porch and line up according to their bus number.
- For safety reason, the bus attendant will only release P1 and P2 students when the parent or authorised personnel is present at the drop off point. Otherwise, the bus driver will bring the child back to school.
- Please remind your child/ward to observe all safety rules when on board the school bus. He/She is also expected to be obedient and respectful to both bus driver and bus attendant. Any recalcitrant behaviosur will be addressed by the school.

### **Visitor Management - By Appointment Only**

- We encourage parent engagement via phone/video calls/texts/emails.
- If there is a need for parents to meet our staff in person, please make an appointment with them prior to coming to school.
- Our security guards will only allow visitors who have an appointment with our staff.
- Upon arrival, all visitors are to register at the Security Post which is located at Gate 1 (vehicular gate). A visitor sticker will be printed for visitors as a form of identification.

#### **Health-Related Matters**

- As part of everyone's social responsibility, please do not send your child to school if he/she is feeling unwell. We encourage parents to bring your child to seek medical treatment and return to school upon recovery.
- If your child is tested ART positive, please follow MOH's Protocols and inform the school and his/her Form Teachers promptly.

Email	The email addresses of all teachers are available on the school website. Please direct your questions to the respective email address.		
Phone call	The General Office opening hours is from <b>7am to 6pm</b> . You may call the General Office at 6778 3085 during opening hours to leave a message for the teacher to contact you. Please be informed that teachers are not expected to provide their personal phone number to parents/ guardians. If they choose to do so for various reasons, we hope that you will contact them on working days during office hours from <b>7 am to 6.00 pm only</b> .
